
Our greatest super power is our ability to help one another.

SCHOOL FEEDBACK:	 Do you notice your teachers helping others? What are some ways our teachers can help our students even better? In what ways do you think teachers are inter-dependent? 		
EXPERIENTIAL ACTIVITIES			
ROLE-PLAY:	 A person unsuccessfully asking a friend for help. A person skilfully and successfully asking a friend for help. A small group of friends showing examples of inter-dependence. 		
DEBATE:	Topic - Independence is overrated.		
QUIZ:	 How many people are in the drawing? (Ans: 4) What colour t-shirt is the teen who is falling wearing? (Ans: Green) It's not just the teen falling off the tree, what else is falling off the tree? (Ans: Leaves) Who is watching on? (Ans: Squirrel) Each of the 'catching' teens is wearing something extra – one has a cape, one has glasses, and one has? (Ans: A hat)
